
## Contemporary Or Baptist

- B Bible Authority, KJV
- A Autonomy of the local church
- P Priesthood of the Believer
- T Two ordinances:
  Baptism and the Lord's
  Supper
- I Individual Soul Liberty
- S Saved and Baptized
- T Two Offices: Pastor and Deacon
- S Separated: Personally, and the Church from the State.

## "C's" that identify churches:

- <u>Casual</u> That is a word that has always been associated with complacent, worldly churches. We wear our Sunday best! Dr. Hyles (pictured above) was always a notch above the average even in his casual dress.
- <u>Critical</u> The world's churches have always been critical of old-fashioned ideas, but today the same criticism is common in Baptist circles as well.
- <u>Conviction</u> Music, dress, dating, movies --Baptists used to preach on these things.

- Contemporary Our Baptist brethren have always been oldfashioned or considered outdated.
- **Convenient** There is nothing convenient about a cross. Bible-believing churches have always taught a life-style of self-denial, not convenience.
- <u>Change</u> As I have dealt with elsewhere at length, change has no place in the church. We were given direction to teach "the same." (2 Timothy 2:2)
